Dear Residents and Families/Representatives,

Please accept this letter as our weekly update regarding the status of COVID-19 in our facility. We are happy to report that we currently have no confirmed cases of COVID-19 in our facility.

Visitation information

- ***For vaccinated residents and visitors:*** when visits are in a resident’s private room (no roommate) or designated visitation area, residents and their visitors may choose to have close contact (including touch) and to NOT need to wear source control (mask). However, the visitor(s) must still pass a screen upon entry and wear a mask to and from the designated area of visitation. The visitor should socially distance from healthcare personnel and other residents and visitors.
- ***When either the resident or the visitor is not fully vaccinated*** the safest approach for everyone is an outdoor visit, social distancing and source control (mask). However, if the resident is fully vaccinated and they choose to have close contact (including touch) with their visitor(s), both must wear well-fitting source control (masks). The visitor would still need to pass a screen upon arrival for the visit.

Monday – Friday	6 PM – 8 PM	2 visitations per evening
Saturday & Sunday	9AM – Noon	3 visitations per day

Visits start at the top of the hour and last 30 minutes. No more than 2 visitors at each visit, if your visit is planned for indoors. If more than 2 people at a time would like to visit, we suggest requesting an outdoor or window visit to accommodate the visitation. As always, if these visitation times do not fit into your schedule, please reach out to us for other opportunities. Please schedule with our receptionist at 301-334-2319.

We ask that you do not schedule standing appointments week over week. This process will promote opportunities for residents to have a variety of options with visitations.

Please continue to check our website for weekly updates as well as notification of new cases. As always, we will notify you if we receive confirmation of a new positive case in our facility and we will reach out to you individually if your loved one is displaying symptoms of COVID-19 or tests positive for COVID-19.
